

HOW TO COLLECT SIGNATURES ACCORDING TO STATE LAW:

Move Oregon's Border is not doing a statewide petition this year. Each of our petitions can only be signed by people registered to vote in the specific county mentioned by the petition.

Believe it or not, **YOU are a petition circulator.** Anyone may collect signatures. If you observed the signing of each signature on the sheet, afterwards, you may sign the bottom of the page as the petition circulator. Make sure you do- **a signature is required at the bottom.** Even if the only signature you gather is your own signature, you can still be the petition circulator for that page. If you leave it unattended, someone might spoil it by signing it without you witnessing the act. If you leave it out in public, then pick it up again when you are not attending it.

Page 3 and 4 MUST be printed back-to-back on a single sheet of paper to be accepted by the state. Just turn the page over and run it through the printer again. Print on 8½ by 11 inch white paper of at least 20lb weight (normal paper). Print each page at least once, and print page 3 and 4 as much as necessary, and bring them all when collecting signatures. If you can't figure out how to print back-to-back, ask a copy store to do it.

Many Oregonians have found that the state messed up their voter registration. When someone is willing to sign, first ask them to help you verify that his voter registration is **active** and located in the correct county. They can not sign unless this is true. They can update their registration online on the spot, with their current address. Use a voter registration site such as:

Please turn in this petition (page 3 and 4) well before Aug 4, 2021 (or Feb 16, 2022) so we can collect, organize, and

submit them before then. You can mail it to Valerie Gottschalk's address on page 3 or drop it off at Selma Hardware Store, 18398 Redwood Hwy, Selma W-F 8-5:30, Sat/Sun 9-6. Let us know if you've got more than 50 signatures so we'll know when we have enough.

Recruit: If someone signs, ask them if they would like their own sheet to start collecting signatures on their own. We are here to collect signatures, but also to build the movement and campaign for a big yes vote.

Text of proposed ordinance 2020-1: Support Moving Oregon's Border to the North of Josephine County

Section 1. The People of Josephine County find that:

- 1) Borders between states have been moved or redefined many times in United States history. For example, the border between Minnesota and North Dakota was relocated by an interstate compact approved by United States Congress H.R. 7189 (August 25, 1961) .
- 2) Oregon and Idaho could legislate an interstate compact to place the following counties under the jurisdiction of Idaho rather than Oregon: Baker, Coos, Crook, Curry, Douglas, Gilliam, Grant, Harney, Jackson, Josephine, Klamath, Lake, Malheur, Morrow, Sherman, Umatilla, Union, Wallowa, and Wheeler. The following territory could also be under the jurisdiction of Idaho rather than Oregon:
 - a) That portion of Wasco County that is east of the Deschutes River, plus the City of Maupin
 - b) All of Jefferson County except Deschutes National Forest and Warm Springs Indian Reservation
 - c) Deschutes County communities of Eagle Crest, Terrebonne, Redmond, Alfalfa, southeastern Deschutes County, Three Rivers (east of Deschutes River), and La Pine.
- 3) The region defined in this section can expect a great improvement in productivity and a reduction in cost of living when these areas are freed from Oregon regulations and taxes. This will make them a financial boon to Idaho.
- 4) The region defined in this section has approximately 21% of Oregon's population. According to the 2017 US government BEA statistics, adjusted for state prison population, this region had a per capita personal income of approximately \$41,248 per year, similar to that of Idaho, but the remainder of Oregon had a per capita personal income of approximately \$50,006 per year. This means that the budget of the state of Oregon would improve if it allowed these areas to fall under the jurisdiction of Idaho.
- 5) The region defined in this section votes differently than the remainder of Oregon and desires different policies from its state government. It gave about two votes to Donald Trump in the 2016 presidential election for every vote it gave to Hillary Clinton, similar to Idaho. In contrast, the remainder of Oregon gave more than 1.6 votes to Hillary Clinton for every vote given to Donald Trump.

Section 2. Policy:

- 1) Whereas it is the sense of Josephine County that Oregon should begin negotiations with Idaho to relocate the Oregon/Idaho border to make this county a county of Idaho,
- 2) Therefore, it shall be the policy of the government of this county to facilitate efforts by the state of Oregon to negotiate a relocation of the Oregon/Idaho border to a location somewhat north of this county. The policy of the county government shall be to:
 - a) Promptly fulfill lawful requests for relevant information from the governments of the state of Oregon and the state of Idaho, and
 - b) Make the county prepared for a relocation of the border, at a time and to the extent that there are indications that a relocation is becoming likely.

Section 3.

- 1) The People of Josephine County do resolve by this instrument that the Josephine County Government shall not delay the fulfillment of lawful requests for information from the governments of the state of Oregon or Idaho that are designated by that state to be requests in support of negotiations to relocate the Oregon/Idaho border to a location somewhat north of this county.
- 2) When the meaning of the term "delay" is disputed, it shall be the duty of the County Clerk to determine what actions or period of time shall be considered a delay as the term is used in this ordinance.

Section 4. Penalties:

- 1) Anyone within the jurisdiction of the County found in violation of Section 3 of this ordinance may be made a defendant in a civil proceeding by the county seeking redress of the violation, per ORS 203.065
- 2) Fines recovered under ORS 203.030 – 203.075 shall be paid to the clerk of the court in which recovery is had. After first deducting court costs in the proceedings, the clerk shall pay the remainder to the treasurer of the county for the general fund of the county, per ORS 203.065.
- 3) A civil offense against this ordinance is a Class A violation, per ORS 203.065, with a maximum fine of \$300 for an individual, and \$1000 for a corporation, per ORS 153.018.
- 4) Any peace officer, as defined by ORS 161.015, may enforce this ordinance, adopted under ORS 203.035.

Section 5. Severability:

If any provision of this ordinance or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this ordinance or the application of its provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby.

Section 6. This ordinance, named Support Moving Oregon's Border to the North of Josephine County, shall be effective immediately upon passage.

Ordinance Requiring Josephine County Facilitate Making County Part of Idaho

Question: Should County adopt an ordinance requiring its employees to cooperate with State officials to relocate County to Idaho?

Summary: This new ordinance would require Josephine County employees to cooperate with officials in Idaho and Oregon to make Josephine County a part of Idaho. The ordinance requires County employees to promptly, and without delay, fulfill lawful requests for information from Oregon and Idaho state governments when such requests are in support of negotiations to relocate the Oregon/Idaho border to a location somewhat north of this County and to prepare for relocation of the border at a time and to the extent that there are indications that a relocation is becoming likely.

When the meaning of 'delay' is disputed, it shall be the duty of the County Clerk to determine what actions or period of time shall be considered a delay as the term is used in this ordinance.

Violators of this ordinance are subject to a Class A violation, including a maximum of \$300.00 per individual, and \$1,000.00 for a corporation. Any peace officer may enforce this ordinance.

Instructions for Circulators

- 1 Only active registered voters of the county, city or district may sign the petition.
 - 2 Have signers use a pen when signing petitions. Use a pen when you are certifying petitions.
 - 3 Only one circulator may collect signatures on any one signature sheet of the petition.
 - 4 You must personally witness all signatures you collect and you should not collect additional signatures on the petition sheet once you have signed and dated the circulator certification.
 - 5 **It is against the law for circulators to:**
 - Circulate a petition containing a false signature.
 - Make false statements to any person who signs the petition or requests information about it.
 - Attempt to obtain the signature of a person who is not qualified to sign the petition.
 - Offer money or anything of value to another person to sign or not sign the petition.
 - Sell or offer to sell signature sheets.
 - Write, alter, correct, clarify or obscure any information about the signers unless the signer is disabled and requests assistance or the signer initials after the changes are made.
 - Accept compensation to circulate a petition that is based on the number of signatures obtained.
- Warning** Violations of the circulator requirements may result in conviction of a felony with a fine of up to \$125,000 and/or prison for up to 5 years.

Instructions for Signers

- 1 Only active Oregon voters may sign the petition. Sign your full name, as you did when you registered to vote.
- 2 Fill in the date you signed the petition, your printed name and residence address in the spaces provided. Only you may complete your optional information.
- 3 Initial any changes the circulator makes to your printed name, residence address or date you signed the petition.
- 4 Use a pen when signing the petition.
- 5 **It is against the law for signers to:**
 - Sign another person's name under any circumstances.
 - Sign a petition more than one time.
 - Sign a petition when you are not qualified to sign it.
