

How to move the Oregon / Idaho border

Step 0: Convince county commissioners or city council to put a question on that ballot.

Step 1: Counties or cities vote to prove to state legislators that eastern Oregon wants to join Idaho.

11 of 15 counties there have voted in favor so far, and more will vote soon.

Step 2: Idaho Legislature holds hearings.

Our first hearing was April 12, 2021.

Step 3: Oregon Legislature holds hearings.

Step 4: Oregon and Idaho Legislatures invite each other to consider the issue by passing a joint memorial or resolution

Step 5: Oregon & Idaho leaders negotiate.

Step 6: State legislatures ratify an interstate compact that sets the terms of the border relocation, such as which assets and liabilities become Idaho's.

Step 7: Optionally, the compact authorizes a plebiscite (vote) for eastern Oregon voters as a whole to consent to, or veto, the compact.

Step 8: Congress approves the interstate compact and amends acts of admission of both states.

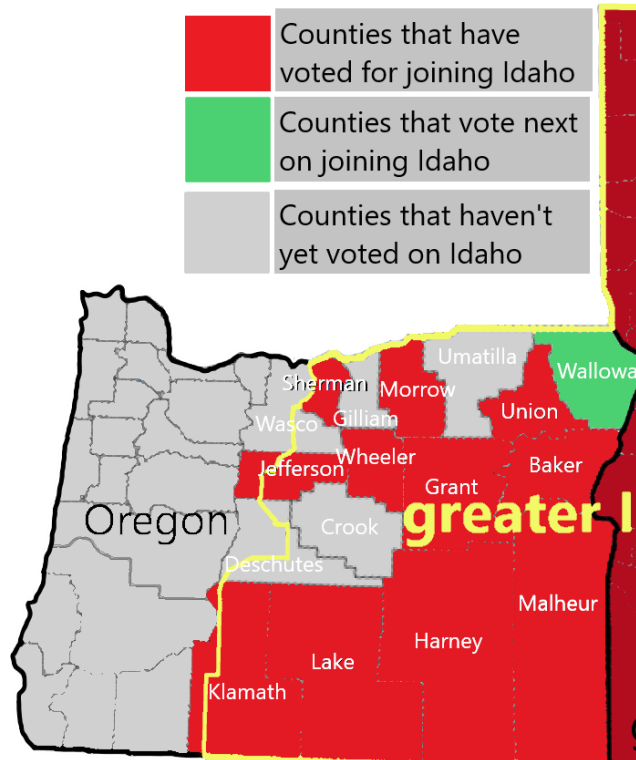

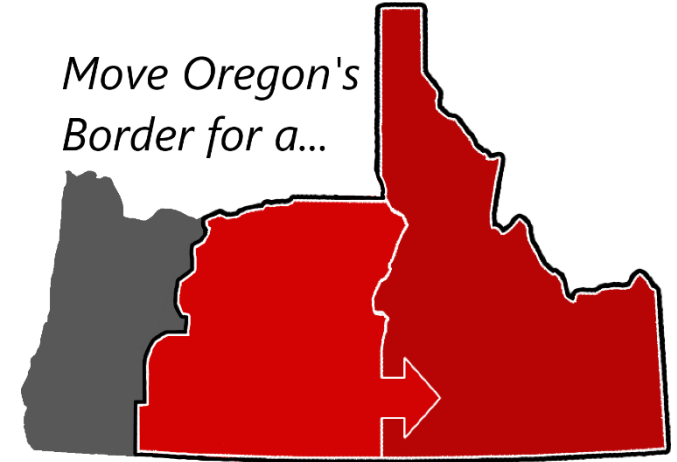
We are a grassroots movement. We need to unite our neighbors around the idea of moving the border so that we can convince state legislators to stop holding our counties captive.

Can eastern Oregon have a voice in state decisions without moving the border? No.

The ruling party in the Oregon Legislature doesn't have a single representative from a rural district or from eastern Oregon. But our reps would be in the ruling party in Idaho, where our concerns and needs would be heard.

Will the Oregon Legislature let our counties go? At greateridaho.org we listed reasons the Oregon Legislature should want to release "low-income, Trump-voting" counties.

Did anyone ask Idaho? Yes, the governor welcomes the idea, as well as the head of the Idaho Senate and much of the House.

Why not make a new state? We don't think the Oregon Legislature would let us have our own state because that would add Republicans to the US Senate.

Why not just give each county a senator so Republicans can win again? Oregon used to do that, but the Supreme Court forced Oregon to change to one man, one vote. The Oregon Legislature would never vote to reverse this anyway.

What about minimum wage? Only 7% of Oregonian and 2% of Idahoan workers earn minimum wage. Everyone else's wages are set by supply and demand in the labor market, not by law. A high minimum wage closes businesses in rural areas. Counties can increase their minimum wage if they want to do so.

What about licenses? We expect professional & driver's licenses to be grandfathered in.

WHY SHOULD COUNTIES WANT TO BECOME A PART OF IDAHO?

The Oregon/Washington border was relocated in 1958.

Now it's time to relocate the Oregon/Idaho border.

Oregon is ruled by politicians with Portland values and priorities. They don't understand how we make a living. Their decisions damage industries like timber, mining, trucking & farming. We don't want a handout. We want our communities to thrive.

Eastern Oregon is in an abusive relationship with Willamette Valley. Valley politicians refuse to protect citizens from criminals and illegals, and then infringe your right to defend your family. The public school curriculum teaches the next generation to hate Americans and Americanism. Your tax money goes to things that violate your conscience. It's time to end this abusive relationship.

Voting patterns prove that eastern Oregon does not belong in Oregon. Eastern Oregon votes 70% Republican. It's bigger than politics: it's our culture. But northwestern Oregon has 79% of Oregon's voters. Their state legislators ignore ours, because their majority doesn't need the votes of rural state legislators to pass laws, and their state legislators are of a different party.

Lower Tax Rates

Idaho is the state with the 8th smallest tax burden, and Oregon ranks 33rd, according to <https://taxfoundation.org/tax-freedom-day-2019> Combining all taxes together, including Idaho's sales tax and Oregon's hidden sales taxes, the average Idahoan pays \$1722 less in taxes per year than the average Oregonian. That's averaging together every adult or child. Oregon tax rates will continue to go up due to a lack of willingness to control spending
